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## Multi Colored Triangle Wrap

Designed by Karin Rüttinger for **skacel collection, Inc.**



**SKILL LEVEL:** Experienced

**SIZE:** Approx 45" x 43"

### MATERIALS:

**Featured Yarn:** Schoppel Zauberball 100, 100% Merino Wool; 437 yds / 100g ball (shown in #1505); 4 balls required.

**addi® Needles:** 3.0 mm (approx US 2) circular needle

*or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Additional Notions:** Stitch markers

All yarn and needles distributed by **skacel collection, Inc.**

**GAUGE:** 22 sts and 44 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") in Garter st

To save time, check your gauge  
and read all instructions thoroughly before beginning.

### STITCH PATTERNS:

**Garter St:** Knit every row.

**Wrap and Turn in Garter St (w&t):** Knit indicated number of stitches. Turn. Wyif, sl1 stitch pwise onto RH needle. Pull working yarn firmly to the back over RH needle, creating two stitches out of the one just slipped (doubled stitch). Continue to knit across the row. On following row, knit the strands of the doubled stitch(es) together.

**Selvage st:** When specified, the selvage st is slipped at the beginning of the row. When not specified, it is simply knit.

***Note:** The shawl is worked from the middle triangle outward in short rows. The wrong side will be facing.*

### INSTRUCTIONS:

(See schematic for [#]'s throughout)

**[1]** To work middle triangle, CO 1. Work all rows in Garter St. At beg of next row and every other row, kfb (inc 1). Continue until there are 10 sts, then work even for 3 rows.

At beg of next row and every other row, SKPO (dec 1). Cont until 2 sts rem, K2tog = 1 stitch.

**[2]** A small corner must be worked to begin the next section. CO 9 sts = 10 sts. From now on, the shawl will be worked in short rows as follows:

K1, w&t, knit back.

K2, w&t, knit back.

K3, w&t, knit back.

Cont in this pattern until 9 sts have been knit.

Knit the 10th st tog with the corner st of the first triangle **[1]** as follows: Sl the 10th st, knit the selvage st and pass the slipped st over = 10 sts. **[3]** Turn, sl the first st, k9, turn, k9, sl the 10th st, knit the next selvage st of the triangle, and pass the 10th slipped st over. Turn, sl the first stitch, k9, turn, k9, sl the 10th st, knit the next selvage st of the triangle, and pass the slipped st over.

Cont working in this manner until all of the selvage sts on the first side of the triangle have been knit. Sl1, knit to the bottom edge of **[4]**.

**Row 1:** K9, leave the 10th st unworked, turn.

**Row 2:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st (see w&t instructions), k8, turn.

**Row 3:** K8, (leave the doubled st unworked), turn.

**Row 4:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st, k7, turn.

**Row 5:** K7, (leave the 2 doubled sts unworked), turn.

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**Row 6:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st, k6, turn.

Cont working in this manner until all sts have been worked as doubled sts (9 doubled sts and 1 unworked st from the first row). The last doubled st is located at the outside corner of the triangle [4]. Mark this corner.

Next row, knit all 9 doubled sts (both loops of the doubled st tog as 1 stitch) and knit the 10th st tog with the corner selvage st of triangle [1]. Turn work, sl the first stitch, k9, then work doubled sts as for short rows like above, working inward from the outer edge.

**Row 1:** K1, turn.

**Row 2:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st, turn.

**Row 3:** Knit the doubled st (both loops of the doubled st tog as 1 st), k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st, k1, turn.

**Row 5:** K1, knit the doubled st, k1, turn.

**Row 6:** Work the first stitch as a doubled st, k2, turn.

**Row 7:** K2, knit the doubled st, k1, turn.

Continue working in this manner until you reach the last stitch on the inner edge of [4]. Knit the 10th st tog with the selvage st of the next edge of [1]. Knit to the outer edge.

Work along the next triangle side as before [3] until you reach the next corner.

This corner [5] will be worked in numerous steps. CO 10 sts = 20 sts total. K2 of the CO sts, turn, w&t, knit the selvage st, turn, knit the selvage st, knit the doubled st from the previous row, k1, turn, w&t, work back, turn, knit the selvage st, k2 (1 stitch is the doubled st), k1, turn, w&t, work back. Cont working in this manner until all the new CO sts are worked. Work even over these 10 sts, and on every other row knit the 10th stitch together with the first available stitch of the old sts until all of the old sts have been attached.

Work across the next triangle edge as before [3], then work the corner [5] as before. Continue in this manner, using the diagram for assistance. Work a total of 10 'rows' (the first triangle is Row 1, then each time you work back to the starting edge is another row).

After 10 rows, a jagged border will be added on the upper edge. Work 'row' 11 with all inside corners and selvage sts as before, but beginning on the longest side (the top), work a jagged border as follows:

Inc 1 st on the outer edge every other row 5 times (work the inc 1 st before the selvage st) = 15 sts.

Now, on the outer edge where the sts were increased, k2tog along the edge on every 2nd row five times. The jagged border is now complete. The entire upper border will be worked in this manner.

The first side border will be worked as follows:

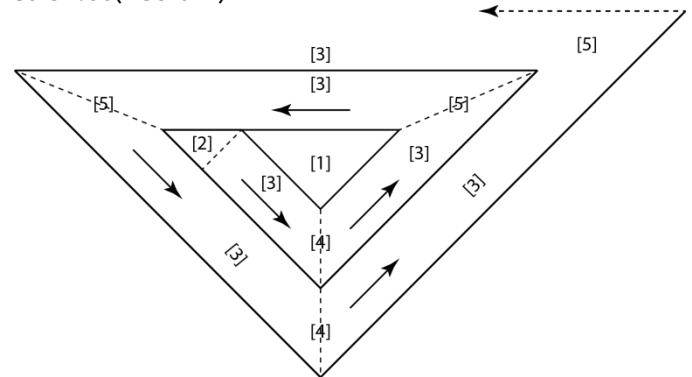
\*Inc 1 stitch on the outer edge every 4th row 5 times (work the inc 1 stitch before the selvage st) = 15 sts. On the next row, BO the 5 inc sts; repeat from \* until the first side is complete.

On the next side (on the outer edge), \*CO 5 sts, then K2tog on every 4th row 5 times = 10 sts; repeat from \* until the end of the corner.

BO last 10 sts.

**Finishing:** Weave in ends and block. Fold the outer corner of the long side inward toward the middle triangle and sew small seams to create fastened armholes if desired, so that the shawl does not slip off the shoulders.
